## Board of Trustees Three Expectations for Student Learning

- 1. All students in Pembina Trails will be personally and intellectually engaged in their learning at school.
- 2. By the end of grade 8, all students in Pembina Trails will meet the provincial curricular standards in literacy and numeracy, allowing them the greatest possibility for success in high school.
- 3. All students in Pembina Trails will graduate from high school.

#### **School Plan Priorities:**

- Numeracy: 100% of our students will have achieved grade level expectation or student specific outcome with basic number facts and estimation.
- Literacy: 100% of our students will have achieved grade level expectations or student specific outcome in writing.

## **Progress Toward School Plan Priorities:**

- We have met once a cycle as a professional learning team to work towards our goals, discussing individual class needs and looking at our grade level outcomes and exemplars.
- We have lead and participated in literacy and numeracy professional development sessions.
- Professional Development on being calm, alert and ready to learn was also a focus as a whole staff and as a book study.
- A Time for Learning, a Time for Joy curriculum is fully implemented in our full day Kindergarten. We have had many visitors to our Kindergarten class from other schools and divisions.
- We have examined our collected school-wide data. This includes Strong Beginnings, Classroom Reviews, Literacy Data Base, Report cards, Tell Them from Me Surveys, grade 3 Provincial Assessment, classroom assessments and observations.
- 94% of our students have met our numeracy goal.
- 94% of our students have met our literacy goal.

#### Progress Toward the Three Expectations for Student Learning 2015/2016:

- Universal Design for Learning, differentiated instruction and assessments, inquiry based.
- Learning, hands on activities and purposeful play are used to engage our students in learning.
- Many students have participated in our clubs, teams and cross grade house activities this school year.
- Students have been engaged with hands on, inquiry based learning and with technology to enhance student learning outcomes.
- Students set personal learning goals and meet regularly with their teacher(s).
- Students are moving on to the next grade level with the academic skills that they need to have in order to move towards the expectation of success with the grade 8 outcomes.
- Data is carefully collected and examined by staff to improve student achievement.
- Our school data shows that our students have a good foundation. We connect with our families to build relationships and we work together towards the target of grade 12 graduation.
