## Dieppe Parent Advisory Committee <br> Principal \& Vice-principal report September 20, 2021

- We are excited to be here for our first PAC meeting - welcome to all those for whom it is their first time too
- We have 17 classes at Dieppe this year:
o Two AM kindergarten (Mme Dueck \& Mme Tugby)
o One PM kindergarten (Mme Dueck)
o Three Grade 1 (Mme Saltiss, Mme Kapinga, Mme Borlase)
o One $1 / 2$ combined (Mme Nicholls, Mme Schur)
o Three Grade 2 (M. Kowalski, Mme Santos, Mme Wilkins)
o Three Grade 3(Mme Emanuel, Mme Chandler, Mme Paton)
o One $3 / 4$ combined (Mme Sul)
o Three Grade 4 (Mme Davie, Mme Ferguson, Mme Johnson)
- Most of our classes have between 22 and 26 students in them
- Because of COVID protocols asking to limit the number of people in the school, we were unable to do an in-person "Meet the Teacher" evening. Instead, teachers prepared welcome videos which were shared with families and the feedback we received was very positive.
- The first few days of school have gone well. There were a few bumps in the first week, but we feel that things have been running more smoothly since last week.
- COVID protocols that are in place:
o Anyone who enters the school must be wearing a mask - including students
o All adults working in the school are fully vaccinated or are undergoing frequent testing
o Students are cohorted and have designated entry and exit doors
o Recesses and lunch are staggered
- Grade 3s \& 4s - AM recess (10), lunch recess (11:45), PM recess (1:50)
- Grade $1 \mathrm{~s} \& 2 \mathrm{~s}$ - AM recess (10:30), lunch recess (12:15), PM recess (2:20)
o Schoolyard is divided into 3 zones. Students spend a full-day in one zone and rotate through the three zones twice over the six-day school cycle
- Cross-country and soccer clubs have begun for the Grade 3 s and 4 s . Mr. Eldridge is looking forward to having intramurals for all grades over the lunch hour soon.
