



Caring for Our Watersheds Final Competition 2022

The Caring for Our Watersheds (CFOW) program asks students in grades 7-12 to submit a proposal that answers the question, "What can you do to improve your watershed?" Students must research their local watershed, identify a concern, and draft a written proposal containing one realistic sustainable solution.

The CFOW program began in Alberta in 2007 and was brought to Manitoba in 2010. The contest is currently offered in Canada within Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba; in the United States within Colorado, California, Ohio, Chesapeake Bay; and in Argentina.

Nutrien Ltd. is the founder and sponsor of the CFOW program. They provide \$17 000 in cash prizes for the top 10 entries and their school or club. An additional \$10 000 in implementation funding is available for all participants to turn their ideas into reality. From a dance awareness show to education initiatives and shoreline cleanups, **over 80 projects have been implemented** across the province since the contest began.

This year, despite the number of school cancellations due to the weather and the pandemic, there were still **250 submissions** from **370 students** from **22 schools** across the province!

Proposals submitted by students were judged by a panel of experts to determine the top 10. Those top 10 competed in a verbal final competition, and the results were announced at a live event held at the Harry J. Enns Wetland Discovery Centre at Oak Hammock Marsh on Saturday, April 30th.
