Pembina Trails School Division has 36 schools spread out across the southwest of Winnipeg. Two new schools – Bison Run (6) and Pembina Trails Collegiate (22) – have been built halfway between Kenaston Boulevard and Waverley Street on the south side of Bison Drive. Two new schools (37 & 38), west of Kenaston, are the site of potential future K-8 schools.

Pembina Trails School Division operates 36 public schools in the Southwestern quarter of Winnipeg.

Projected Enrolment for the 2026-2027 School Year is 17,971, an increase of 464 students (2.7%) over last year's actual enrollment or 120 students (0.7%) over last year's projected enrollment.






Expenses Per Student
