SUBJECT: COVID-19 Vaccine Town Halls with Doctors

Doctors Manitoba has planned a Vaccine Town Hall for Youth and Parents on Tuesday, June 22 at 6:30PM. The town hall will allow Manitobans to ask questions and raise concerns about the COVID-19 vaccines and get trusted answers from doctors.

"As doctors, we care about the health of Manitobans and we want to share what we know about the COVID-19 vaccines," said Dr. Kristjan Thompson, President of Doctors Manitoba. "Manitobans can always get advice from their physician, and now our town hall will offer another option to get the answers you need about the vaccines."

The town hall will be broadcast live on YouTube. Questions can be submitted advance at ManitobaVaccine.ca or live during the town halls

Hosted by Ace Burpee, the town hall includes a group of knowledgeable pediatricians:

- Dr. Marni Hanna, pediatrician and president of the Manitoba Pediatric Society
- Dr. Ruth Grimes, pediatrician and president of the Canadian Pediatric Society
- Dr. William Li, pediatrician, and medical lead for the Kids and COVID-19 session last spring
- Dr. Jared Bullard, pediatric infectious disease specialist

All students and parents are encouraged to attend. Dr. Thompson noted there is a lot of information circulating about the vaccines right now, some accurate and some misleading. "These are new vaccines for a new disease. It's natural to have questions, and doctors want to share the facts so you can make an informed decision about getting immunized."

Manitobans can access answers to common vaccine questions anytime at <u>ManitobaVaccine.ca</u>, a site created by s physicians for Manitobans about COVID-19 vaccines.

Please note: This invitation does not need to be limited to students age 12+ as the vaccines will likely be approved soon for younger ages.

Shared Health have identified a physician who has been in touch with DSFM about possibly planning a francophone town hall at a later date, but this is not yet confirmed.

FACULTY OF EDUCATION—UNIVERSITY OF **MANITOBA WEBINAR SERIES ON BILL 64**

The Faculty of Education is hosting a webinar series on Bill 64. Part 1: "Proposed K-12 Education Reform: What does it mean? Why does it matter?" was already held on Thursday, June 10 and featured panellists Dr. Jon Young, Professor Emeritus in the Faculty of Education, Dr. Thomas Falkenberg, Acting Dean and Professor of Education from U of M and Dr. Jacqueline Kirk, Chair of Leadership & Education Administration Department in the Faculty of Education at Brandon University.

It is not too late to register for Part 2, which is being held on Thursday, June 17 at 7 p.m. Check out the details online.

Bill 64 lays out an Administrative Agency model of governance and argues that its School Community Councils and a Provincial Advisory Council provides are appropriate form structures for public participation in providing for our children's education. I remain to be convinced. School boards are too important to lose, and a vision of creating better education by weakening public participation in it makes little sense to me - and it matters!


