WINTER WEATHER WEAR

VISITORS / EARLY PICK-UP / LATE ARRIVAL / ABSENCES

Please continue to use Edsby to notify the office of attendance as well as early pick-ups and late arrivals. Advance notice allows office staff to support having your child ready and waiting for your arrival. Feel free to call the office at 204-452-3040 if you have forgotten to input attendance in Edsby.

If you are visiting the school to speak with a staff member, it is best to call and book an appointment by calling the main office. Entry is only allowed through the front main doors, by ringing the doorbell located to the right (in a silver box) of the front door on Beaumont Street.

BACK LANE and FRONT STREET

We are noticing unsafe driving behaviours during after-school pick-up, which creates an unsafe environment for our students.

To ensure student safety and to keep traffic flowing, there is no right-hand turn from Beaumont Street into the back lane between 3:30–4:30 p.m. The lane remains a two-way street therefore, be aware of vehicles exiting onto Beaumont Street. Please make every effort to use an alternative location for pick-ups.

Please use **Daniel Street** for pick-up and make use of side streets whenever possible. Keeping Beaumont Street clear during this time is essential for the safe arrival and departure of our students and buses.
