The learning atmosphere in the classroom is the first consideration in the formation of class groupings. Classes are organized to maximize learning and teaching opportunities for students. - Student/teacher learning and teaching styles
- Placement of students new to Royal School
- Class sizes at specific grade levels
- Parent information

We ask that families trust the decisions made by staff for classroom placements. It has been our experience that almost all placements are successful. Families can assist the class formation process by helping their children to understand the importance of class formation and supporting placements that are made. Your child's homeroom for the 2023-24 school year will be indicated on their Term 3 Report Card at the end of June.
