#### ADMINISTRATION UPDATE - DARREN OUGHTON/MICHELLE BARCLAY

Enrollment (currently) = 445 students

0	K	29 (14 & 15)
0	Grade 1 / 2	85 (4 classrooms with 20-22 kids/class)
0	Grade 3 / 4	101 (4 classrooms with 23 -25 kids/class)
0	Grade 5 / 6	118 (5 classrooms with 23-25 kids/class)
0	Grade 7 / 8	110 (5 classrooms with 22-25 kids/class)

## Facilities Update

- Kindergarten room will get new flooring over the summer
- The risers will be taken out as there are cords that are currently running through the classroom and it is creating a hazard for students.
- Summer watering Michelle has coordinated with the two daycares to water the plants, trees, and flower beds over the summer on a planned schedule.

# Staffing Update

- Staffing levels will remain status quo for next year
- We will have 2 kindergarten classes, 4 grade 1 / 2, 4 grade 3 / 4, 5 grade 5 / 6, and 5 grade 7 / 8 classes.
- School of choice applications cannot be approved until the end of April at the earliest.
- LM postings went up today
  - Ms. Johnson going down part-time.
  - There are 79 postings in the division, individuals may apply for them. This
    potentially could create further staffing shifts at LM that are not known of
    vet.
  - Movement in the division is encouraged, to allow teachers to obtain broader experience.

- Curriculum and Learning
  - Outdoor learning day April 23<sup>rd</sup> Earth Day.
  - Outdoor learning days will take place every week for May and June starting on May 14<sup>th.</sup>
  - Classes are creating land acknowledgements as we continue to learn about Treaty Education and the calls to action for reconciliation.
  - Track, Beach Volleyball and Ultimate are underway.
  - Grade 6 Band Festival is on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.
  - Grade 7 and 8 Moose Jaw Band trip is taking place on May 12 14.
- Ouestions for Admin
  - Question asked about class placements.
    - Darren noted that Class Solver is used to initially balance the classes and then it goes back to the teachers for adjustments. Teachers ensure a good fit friend for each student will be in their class. This is not necessarily their best friend, but a good peer relation that works for a good learning environment.
    - Class Solver considers where students are in learning, where they are as EAL students (1-4), gender, and it creates a class that balances all of these components.
    - Can put up to 5 friend requests in the system and can even say which kids should not be together.
    - The focus is on balancing the class on needs, and adjustments can be made and make sure kids are in the best spot.
  - Question asked about the recent cyber event.
    - Administration has no information.
    - Darren recommended reaching out to the trustees.
    - Information was compromised and nothing new has transpired (info on the dark web).
    - Division has hired a cyber security company to rectify the situation.
