## 3. Facilities/Equipment Update

- Bike Cage (joint venture with PAC)
  - This is going well, some minor hiccups to ensure children are picking up their bikes at designated times. Reminders will be sent.
  - Daycares will receive code to open bike cage for students in before and after care
  - Physical Education staff are aware of the code as well to ensure students coming for early practices and staying for games can access the bike cage after hours.

- 4. Curriculum and Learning

We may consider inviting gr 6 students (based on grade 7 interest and by polling grade 6 parents first), so when the trip takes place students will be in grade 7/8. Another option will be to work with another school with grade 8 students.
- Cross country meets
  - Grades 4-8 (2 meets at Marj Edey Park) and grades 6 8 X-country will also have one meetat Labarriere Park) is underway.
- Grades 6-8 volleyball has some initial teams that will be finalized after exhibition play.
