### 3) Reports:

a) Co-Chairs

Ashton du Plessis and Jill Hinter

- School Start Up
  - Start up has gone well
  - As of this morning we are at 599 students, which is 31 students over projection
  - We have 19 classrooms from Grades 1 to 4 and 5 Kindergarten Classes.
  - We continue to register students from many walks of life while trying to balance the different supports and strategies for what makes up an effective school start up.
- Parking/Bussing
  - In regards to parking, we have had no traffic incidents as our community seems to have settled into the norms of dealing with how the traffic flows in and around the school during start up and end times.
  - Our staff have been amazing at supporting students getting onto the busses and helping regulate the stop/drop zones.
  - Our office staff have been extremely organized in terms of making sure all of the moving parts have been taken care of.



- This year's challenge with bussing has taken on a different flavour. Although we are down to only 7 busses, our busses are a lot larger which presents some challenges in getting students on the bus in a timely fashion.
- We also have struggled to meet the needs of our students with special needs and supporting them in an adequate fashion (by not having enough supports who are able to ride to and from school with them).

#### School Fees

- School fees are once again \$40 (1-4) and \$30 (k).
- Lunch fees are \$170. This allows us to hire the many lunch supervisors needed given that so many of our students eat lunch at school.

#### o Other

- Student behaviour has been excellent so far.
- Student regulation continues to be the focus, teaching students how to play with each other, problem solve and focus on building character.
- In September we focused on WISDOM, October's character strength is GRATITUDE.

### School Events

- Clubs and events are starting up again (grade 4 cross country, grade 3 and 4 choir, indoor soccer starts this week and intramurals have been up and running for a while now).
- Run club will be starting up after cross country is finished on October 10 th.
- Our grade 3 classes have been taking their students to Fort Whyte
- many field trips planned (to the Manitoba Museum and Japanese Cultural Centre just to name a couple of other destinations)

## Major school events that have taken place so far:

- We have organized 3 Welcome to Canada events (2 in August and 1 in September).
- We had over 250 people attend our community club fair/BBQ on September 12 th.
- Orange shirt day was a huge success.
- The Terry Fox Run raised over \$2300.
- We will be once again running concert planning, there will be a myriad of events in the spring and regular assemblies will be taking place).
- Meet the teacher ran on the evening before the first day of classes was again a success, as it allowed for students to see their class, go through their designated entrance, and it played a part in a very smooth first day start up.

#### Tri-Conferences
