12. BY-LAWS AND/OR POLICIES

12.1 By-Law No. 144 - Ward Boundaries (Tuxedo to Move from Ward 2 to Ward 1)

The Secretary-Treasurer indicated that the *Public Schools Act* requires that the representation quotient of any ward in the school division must not vary to an

extent that is greater than 25% or to an extent that is less than 25% of the calculated representation quotient. The quotient is calculated on the number of resident electors within each community divided by the number of trustees that represent that community. Due to the extraordinary growth in Ward 3 that has outstripped the pace of growth in Ward 1, Ward 1 is less than the 25% of the calculated quotient. The Secretary-Treasurer has completed the calculation and the Board made the decision to move the community of Tuxedo from Ward 2 to Ward 1.

It was noted that a ThoughtExchange was conducted to provide the community a tool for engagement with respect to this necessary step to maintain the representation quotient in the Pembina Trails School Division, as set out in the *Public Schools Act*.
