#### **School Bell Times**

Morning Bell Rings at 9:10AM

School Starts at 9:20AM

Children arriving after this time should go to the office for a late slip and sign up for school.

Please note: Supervision outside does not start until 9AM, please do not send your children to school before that time as there are no duty teachers. End of day supervision is only until the crossing guards leave at 4:10pm. All children who are here past that time will be sent up to the office and we will phone home to ensure that someone is coming to get them. The office closes at 4:15pm so please make sure you pick up your children in a timely manner.

#### LUNCH

Bell rings for lunch at 12:05pm- Morning Kindergarten students need to be picked up at that time.

Grades 3-5 play outside from 12:05-12:35pm

1:10pm Afternoon classes begin. Children arriving late report to the office to get a late slip and sign in for school.

3:55pm- End of day for all students. Kindergarten students need to be picked up at their doors. All students need to be picked up in a timely manner. There is only supervision outside for 10 minutes and then students will be brought up to the office and we phone home for parents to pick them up.

#### **School and Lunch Fees**

School fees for all students are \$50 for the year. Teachers purchase school supplies except for shoes, backpacks, and water bottles which parents supply.

Field trip fees will be requested as events occur. Fees must be paid for children to attend field trips. Kindergarten fees include the field trip fees.

Lunch fees are \$200 per child for the year and may be paid in two installments. Please note, fees must be paid for your child to stay for lunch.

Alternate plans will be made for children who are not following the lunch routines and expectations of the lunch supervisors which could include your child going home for lunch. Lunch should be a pleasant experience for all, and we expect our students to behave in a respectful and calm manner during lunch.

We are a nut safe school. Please do **NOT** send any food with nuts or it will be sent home with your child. Please do not order Skip the Dishes or food delivery for your child; the office is very busy at lunch and cannot deliver lunches.



#### **Assessment and Reporting Periods**

Assessment of students means to understand what children know and what they need to know according to the Department of Manitoba Education Curriculum for all grade levels. Assessment is ongoing as teachers continuously determine what students know and what they need to know.

Strong Beginnings: All students will have a Strong Beginnings appointment for one hour with their teacher on either September 18<sup>th</sup> or September 19<sup>th</sup>. This is an opportunity for the teacher to get to know your child and understand where they are on their learning journey.

Kindergarten Students: All students will have an additional readiness assessment which gives the teachers a starting point for their academics.

Tri-Conferences: October 14<sup>th</sup> and October 16<sup>th</sup> appointments with students, parents and teachers.

Tri-Conferences: February 25<sup>th</sup> and February 26<sup>th</sup> student led conferences.

Report Cards: There are three reporting periods throughout the year for grades 1-5, December 18<sup>th</sup>, April 9<sup>th</sup> and June 29<sup>th</sup>.

Kindergarten students have one report card on June 29th.

#### **Transportation**

The division runs our transportation department. The plan is to have schedules on the MyRide K-12 App through the week of August 18-22 for:

- Eligible riders in all grades, including Universal Buses.
- Seat Sale Charters for Shaftesbury, Oak Park and Viscount Alexander.
- All Seat Sales which have been confirmed directly with families, including those serving daycares.

Schedule information will not be emailed to families and will be available on the MyRide K-12 App. (link here on how to access the app).

If your schedule is available on the app between August 18 and 29, your child can begin riding on their first day of school.



Student Drop off is ONLY on Ryerson Ave. in the front of the school. Please STOP your car, DROP - allow your child to exit, and then GO- proceed driving south on Ryerson. If you want to walk your child into the school, you may park further up on Ryerson or on one of the side streets. There is no parking or drop-off on Dalhousie on the school side. It is very important for the safety of all of our students for parents (or anyone doing drop-off) to follow these procedures.



Walking/ Riding to School

We have crossing guards on Dalhousie St. at two locations, and our school safety patrols at additional crosswalks. PLEASE teach and use the crossing guards as the safest way to cross the street. Respect the directives of both the crossing guards and the safety patrols; they are there to keep our children safe!

If students are biking, they should dismount their bike and walk across with the crossing guards. All bikes should be locked up as the school is not responsible for theft.



\*\*If you send your child to school, we assume that they are well enough to participate in all activities including recess and gym. Please keep them home if they are not well enough to participate in all activities during the day.

#### **Snack and Breakfast Program**

Prairie Sunrise School offers a Universal Snack program to each student in our school. They will be provided with a small midmorning snack. We try to offer a nutritional snack each day and sometimes offer a treat. If they choose to bring their own snack, they may check with their teacher to see when they should get their snack bag. Please do not send junk food or soft drinks to school for your child. We adhere to the Nutritional Standards of Pembina Trails School Division. Again, anything we offer is nut-free.

Breakfast Program- Prairie Sunrise School offers an invitational Breakfast Program for children before the start of the school day. Because it is before school, children who ride the bus will not be able to participate. Children will receive a hot breakfast with options of fruit, eggs, cereal, toast, pancakes etc. They will eat breakfast and then go to their classrooms when the bell rings at 9:10am. Expectations for children for this program are that they eat, help with their clean up and behave appropriately.



#### **Library Expectations- Ms. Stewart**

Our school library is a vibrant space with a rich collection of books, technology, and resources.

#### **Book Exchange**

Students have the opportunity to borrow from the school's library collection on their book exchange day. All borrowed materials must be handled with care and returned by the due date to ensure continued access for all members of the school community.

- Students in Grades 1–5 check out 2 books per school cycle.
- Kindergarten students check out 1 book per school cycle.

If a student forgets their books, they'll need to wait until the next library day to check out new ones. This helps students practice responsibility. Being a responsible library user means bringing books back on time so that everyone gets a chance to enjoy them.

#### **Lost or Damaged Books**

A reminder will be sent home and then a fee request if a book is not returned for a few weeks. We do our best to work with families so students can keep reading without stress.

#### **Choosing Books**

The library collection is not organized by reading levels. It is designed to provide a wide range of texts to engage, challenge, and inspire curiosity. Students are encouraged to exercise choice in selecting books that match their interests, needs, and goals as readers, with guidance from the teacher librarian and classroom teachers when appropriate.


#### **Digital Reading**

The library has an eBook collection through **SORA/Overdrive**, which lets students borrow and read digital books anytime, anywhere. Students will need to use their Pembina Trails username and password through the Sora app.

#### **More Than Books**

The library isn't just about reading—it's also a place for creativity, design thinking and experimenting in our **Makerspace**. Students can explore using technology, robotics, Lego, coding, and other hands-on activities.

#### **Physical Education**



Welcome back! We're excited to kick off another school year with opportunities for students to stay active beyond the regular school day. These programs help students build fitness, teamwork, and commitment while having fun.

#### **Cross Country**

This year, both cross country meets will be held at St. Vital Park:

- Wednesday, September 17 at 10:00 a.m.
- Wednesday, October 1 at 10:00 a.m.

Students will be bused to and from the meets. The Cross Country Team is open to Grade 4 and Grade 5 students. To participate, students must attend practices regularly. Practices take place Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at lunchtime. Students will run first and then eat their lunch. Permission forms will be sent home during the first week back.

#### **Active Start**

Active Start is a morning club open to Grades 3, 4, and 5. It runs from 8:30–9:10 a.m. Each grade will have its own designated day. A schedule will be sent home with students so they know which day is theirs. Active Start is a drop-in program so students may choose to come some weeks and not others.

#### Flag Football

Flag Football for Grade 5 students begins this fall. Practices will start in October, with the tournament taking place in November. More information and permission forms will be sent home with interested students closer to the start date.

MUSIC NEWS FOR ALL FAMILIES

Happy 2025-26 school year from the Music Room! I am looking forward to teaching your children music this year, and meeting as many parents as possible throughout the busy and exciting year.

**Kindergarten** – Some important learning highlights: Students are introduced to the different voices in music: Speaking voice, whisper voice, shouting voice, and most importantly, their SINGING VOICE.

They will learn about different high and low sounds, learn about the BEAT, moving to the beat, keeping a beat, and playing instruments on the beat (pulse), Learn how to sit and stand in a circle while listening to the teacher and to others and will play many games that engage their creative minds.

**Grade 1 / 2 –** Students will continue to develop their singing voices, play various pitched and unpitched instruments, create melodies and rhythms, and have opportunities to perform in our Winter concert!

**Grade 3-5 Students** -will be playing the soprano recorder this year. All grade 3 students will need to purchase a YAMAHA soprano recorder from the school. No Dollarama recorders please as they are very poor quality and sound.

**Choir-** Grade 3-5 Students will have the opportunity to join our school choir which will be held at lunch time. This choir will perform at various events this year, including our Remembrance Service, a winter performance, divisional festival, and end of year performance.

**Ukulele Club-** will be offered to Grade 5 students in the Winter term.
